BUS TRANSPORTATION FACTS FOR LOCAL SCHOOL

State Provides Substantial Aid If Rural Agricultural District Is Formed Here

Many misconceptions regarding the transportation of pupils by buses need to be cleared up, according to Willard Mann, chairman of the transportation committee now studying the organization of the Manchester community into a single school district.

When a rural agricultural district is formed, the state provides substantial aid of buses. Each year, the state pays one-seventh the cost of the buses, these payments going on for seven years. Thus, over seven years the entire purchase price is paid for by the state. In addition, the state annually contributes substantially toward the cost of operation.

The law also provides that a school may buy buses on contract, pledging its future state transportation aid for payment. Thus, for little outlay, a district can provide itself with bus transportation.

Buses range in capacity from 48 to 60 passengers. How many could be needed by the enlarged Manchester district would depend on the plan of operation finally adopted by the district. If all students were brought to town from five to six buses would probably be needed. If, for the first year or two (while building plans were being completed) most of the rural schools were kept in operation, the enlarged district might be able to start out with only one or two buses. According to other enlarged districts, such plans can be flexible, with expansion taking place at whatever rate seems best to the voters of the district.

Buses are the safest form of school transportation known. Riding in a bus is much safer than walking the highway or bicycling to school, and far safer than the student driving the family car. Records show this to be the case. Many rural district parents have expressed the opinion

much better to have a bus call for a student than to have him walk a mile more or less, to the country school, as most children do now.

Bus routes are planned so that no student is on the bus longer than 50 to 55 minutes. The ideal would be 45 minutes. While backtracking is to be avoided, since it makes the total trip longer, no child is permitted to walk in unreasonable distance to meet a bus.

In case of stormy weather, the general practice is to take a longer time to deliver all students to their homes.

Bus drivers are carefully screened and selected for their skill, caution, and good character. Bus driving is a part-time occupation, requiring about two hours per day. In the more than 110 consolidated districts in Michigan drivers are farmers, teachers and garage mechanics, and these men are on monthly salary.

The question has been whether kindergarten children will be transported home at noon, or will stay in school until the regular afternoon bus trip. They may be taken home at noon by using one or more of the buses for that purpose, though this involves an extra cost. In most rural agricultural districts an afternoon program is planned for the kindergarten, this program consisting of a play period, a nap on cots, a milk-and-graham-cracker lunch, and educational games. Parents very generally satisfied with this program.
