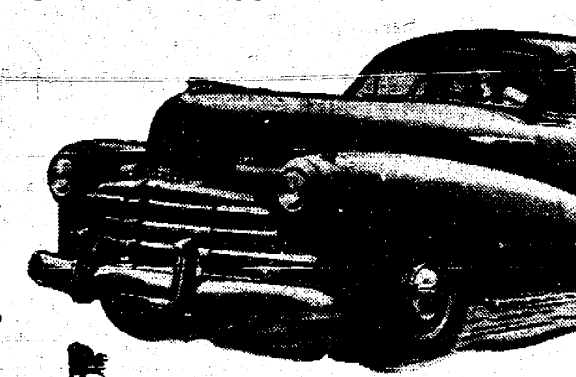

APPLY NOW IF YOU'D LIKE TO SHOOT A DEER THIS YEAR
Applications to participate in the seventh season of antlerless deer hunting in the 24,000-acre crop damage tract in Allegan county December 1-10 are being accepted now by the conservation department.
Closing date for applications is October 5 and a lottery is scheduled for October 11 to determine which one considers applying will get permits. Only 300 permits are issued, and "insiders" may obtain them without making their back in the lottery. "Insiders" this year include residents of the hunting area and the owners, lessees and "sharecroppers" operating farms in the area that furnish the major portion of their livelihood.
A year ago 1,039 including about 40 residents, applied for permits; 262 hunted, killing 37 deer.
Applications are made on forms available on request from the conservation department's game division here, and at Plainwell and Allegan. They must be accompanied by check, draft or money order for \$1.50, the new deer hunting license fee. Winners may use the same license to hunt in the regular deer season, but disqualify themselves if they get a buck then.
