

Every tailored garment should be securely machine-stitched at all points, and stitches made as short as is practical for the material. There should never be any tightness or pulling, as woolens have little "give." and scame will pull out if stretched too much. out it stretched too much.

Use basting abundantly, fit carefully, and take time to do each part of the garment carefully. It will last longer and be a thing of beauty.
