FINANCING DEFENSE—THE TAX PROGRAM

The tax bill just passed by the House of Representatives is the largest and probably the most badly devised tax measure in our history. At a time when we are engaged in a desperate production to strengthen our defense, the new tax bill incorporates confiscatory rates on individuals and corporations and thus levels serious blows against the nation's productive capacity by destroying incentives to build up production.

The tax bill passed by the House shows fundamental shortcomings in all three main categories of tax revenue—individual income, corporate income tax and excises.

When we need millions of men in the armed forces, the government must take men from all income groups. Similarly, when we need billions of additional revenue to pay for our expenditures, the government should levy taxes on all incomes.

The normal and surtax rates have been raised to 52 percent, and a ceiling of 70 percent has been placed on corporate income and excess profits taxes. This means that any reasonably prosperous corporation, large or small, must pay between 52 and 70 percent of its income to the government.

The excise increases embodied in the House bill expand the present illogical, inequitable, and discriminatory group of excises. The result is too little and too late in excise revenue.

Since excises should be levied on the broadest possible base, when it decided to avoid the logical solution of levying a uniform excise tax at a moderate rate, to get substantial revenues, the House was forced to levy heavier special taxes on automobiles, gasoline, on cigarettes and on liquor.



renny Committee, told the House on June 27 that of the 57 Committee amendments at least 25 would be controversial. In addition, he said, Committee members were planning to introduce 100 amendments.

There is nothing wrong about this procedure. There is no reason that representatives should be reluctant to record their stand, and there is every reason that it should be recorded. Representatives should have the courage to propose an amendment, even though the amendment may be unpopular when they are convinced such amendment is against the public interest.

Amendments can be offered on the floor of the House by any one of the 433 Representatives. They can be and frequently are written out in long-hand, with the clerk. Hastily drawn, these amendments may be couched in language which is ambiguous and not well-understood or carefully considered. They may be so complicated as not to be understood by all members, after only one reading, and the five minute debate allowed the author may be inadequate to explain the meaning of the amendment or the reason for its adoption.

The decision of the party leadership to depart from the normal procedure of reporting out a complete bill on a controversial Act occasion would seem to indicate, therefore, the following:

First, that the Administration is intensely displeased with the bill as written by the majority of the Banking and Currency Committee. Second, that the Administration hopes it can get a bill more to its liking out of the whole House and, third, that the majority party can claim that the bill is not as unworkable or not understandable as may well be the result of hastily-written amendments from the floor.







Spoiled Hay Good Source of Mulch. Unusually rains that have spoiled a lot of hay this summer on Michigan farms may have "shown someone some good" by providing orchardists with valuable mulching material. Dr. H. B. Tukey, head of the Michigan State College horticulture department, reports that more orchardists are turning to some form of mulching because their experience with it has been good.

National Farm Safety Week July 22-28
Farm Safety Week is scheduled for July 22 through 28 throughout the nation. We urge you to take this week with a red pencil and make an extra effort to see that your farm is accident proof. Last year 17 million man days were lost due to farm accidents. In our own community one can expect on the average one fatality and one serious injury for every 100 man days that a farmer or some of his machinery out of operation for a considerable period of time. Many of these accidents and mishaps could well have been prevented had the farmer used a little foresight and taken necessary precautions which at times we all find ourselves too busy to take. The result is always that if we had taken those few minutes of protection, we could have saved hours and days of time. Just a few helpful suggestions: (1) make needed repairs on farm machinery when you first notice something wrong; (2) don't wear loose clothing around machinery; (3) stop, look, think, and obey traffic signs; (4) don't drink and drive; (5) be sure your farm is accident proof; (6) don't drink and drive; (7) avoid smoking in the barn; (8) cover all open cuts with a bandage; (9) use proper precautions that can be taken in farm safety. Then, when Farm Safety Week is over, keep these good practices you develop and your chances to pass up accidents are considerably increased.
