





The heavily coated one on the left was dusted by a new electrostatic one on the left was dusted by a new electrostatic process developed by agricultural engineers at Michigan State College. As it leaves the duster's nozzie, dust is highly charged with electricity from special equipment carried on the farmer's tractor and is strongly attracted to plants or fruit, covering them underneath as well as on top. Laboratory tests have reported coverage up to eleven times greater than that accomplished with dusters not equipped with the electrostatic device. Information on this new electrostatic dusting process for insecticides or fungities can be obtained from the Michigan State College Agricultural Engineering Department, East Lansing.




