Jury Finds Youths Guilty Of Murder

serining the death of the Ann Arbor nurse. Miss Campbell, on September 15, brought in a verdict of guilty. First degree murder verdicts were brought against William Morey III and Jacob Max Pell, while the third member, David Lee Royal, received a second degree verdict. William Kramer of Manchester, a retired postal employee and foreman of the jury, said the jurors took several ballots. The attorneys for all three youths said they would discuss the verdict with the boys' parents before deciding upon an appeal. They will be sentenced by Circuit Judge James R. Breakey, jr., December 4. A first degree murder conviction carries a mandatory sentence of life imprisonment and second degree, any number of years up to life.

In the final summation, attorneys for Morey and Pell had contended that their clients had been drunk and not responsible for their actions at the time of the crime. Royal's attorney insisted that Royal had been a victim of circumstances beyond his control.

The court told the jurors that voluntary drunkenness in itself was not an excuse for perpetuation of a crime.
