

Railroad workers are represented by 23 standard unions. By mutual agreement, 20 of these unions—comprising about 1,200,000 men, or more than 90%—are working under wages and rules agreed to by them and the railroads. But leaders of three unions—with only about 130,000 men, or less than 10%—still refuse, after more than a year of negotiations, to accept similar favorable than the terms recommended by the Emergency Board appointed by the President.

Yes, it certainly seems to be finally about time that the leaders of the three unions stop their delaying tastics—their quibbling. But the leaders of the Brotherhood of Locome live Engineers, the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen and Enginemen, and the Order of Railway Conductors

But three unions—with about 130,000
men, or less than 10% of the total—have
refused to accept, even after months of

As a matter of fact, less than half—132,000 to be exact—are in these three unions. More than half—about 1:0.000—are in other unions, principally the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen. What makes the whole situation so hard to understand is that these 140,000 operating employes are working under wages erating employes are working under wages and rules which the leaders of the other 130,000 say they cannot agree to.

What Do the Railroads Offer? They offer these three unions the same settlement which was contained in a Memorandum of Agreement signed at the White House on December 21, 1950, by four brotherhoods and the railroads. Later these brotherhoods sought to repudiate this agreement. But on May 25, 1951, the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainment signed. a complete agreement carrying out the

Since then, terms equal to or better than the Board recommendations have been accepted by about 1,200,000 railmad employes—more than 30% of the total of all workers. They are represented by 20 of the 23 standard railroad unions.

In the White House Agreement includes an increase of 19½ cents an hour (\$1.56 per day). Large sums of retroactive pay have already accrued and if the agreement is carried out, will be paid promptly.

The White House Agreement calls for the establishment of the 40-hour week in principle, for employes in yard service. The employes can have it any time after January I, 1952, provided the manpower situation is such that the railroads can get enough men to perform the work with reasonable regularity at straight time rates. If the parties do not agree on the question of availability of manpower, the White House Agreement provides arbitration by areferee appointed by the President.

FALL CLEANING, TOO



Without a doubt, there are some slip covers which should be dry cleaned (check the manufacturer's recommen-dations on this score). You would be wise, too, to make sure that the fabric is completely colorfast and that the scams are not given to fraying before you consign the covers to the washer. But if the slip cover material meets all those specifications, it can be washed easily and conveniently in a washing machine. Shake the cover well to re-move loose, dusty particles, and close all zippers or snap openings before

you begin. Don't Overload Washer Use hot water in the washer and put the slip covers into the washbasket one at a time. One divan cover, two chair at a time. One divan cover, two char covers or five pillow covers will con-stitute an ample washer load; don't crowd the machine if you want a satis-factory cleaning job done. Wash the slip covers for 5-10 minutes and remove them from the washer im-mediately. Put them in the dryer or these them out on the line until they hang them out on the line until the stretch easily.




