1953 Resolutions

No. 1. Bonding of Markets and Livestock Buyers.

Since the growth of decentralized livestock markets throughout the state, certain steps have been taken to insure the payment of checks to farmers for livestock given by livestock auctions by a law requiring the bonding of each auction to protect the consignors of livestock; it has also come to the attention of farmer consignors that no provision has been made for the assurance that buy-

ers at the auctions giving checks for the payment of livestock are covered by bond to insure payment; it is very evident that with the high value of livestock it is possible that when buyers do not have sufficient funds to cover their purchases, the consignors will become the losers. We therefore favor the bonding of livestock buyers in amounts sufficient to cover their purchases and further that the maximum bond on livestock auctions be increased to more realistically cover

the value of the livestock sold at auctions.

The bond shall contain a provision that any person damaged by failure of the principal to comply with the condition clauses of the bond may maintain suit to recover on the bond even though such person is not a party named in the bond.

No. 2. Testing Cattle at Auctions
The livestock industry represents the largest single agricultural enterprise in the state of Michigan and returns, together with the livestock products, more than \$300,000,000 annually to Michigan farmers. The control of diseases, particularly Bang's disease, is of utmost importance to Michigan farmers and the consuming public.

To expedite the sale of cattle offered for breeding and feeding purpose and to protect the cattle industry in Michigan, we actively support legislation as offered in House Bill No. 187 of the 1952 session of the Michigan legislature, permitting the Department of Agriculture to test cattle at livestock auctions and to charge a fee to the auction sale to be used by the department to cover the costs of such tests.

We understand that this bill was favorably received and passed by the House of Representatives in the 1952 legislature but did not come out of committee in the Senate for vote by senate members. We regret such action was taken by the Senate. We reiterate that House Bill No. 187 of the 1952 session of Michigan legislature is a step in the right direction in the sale of cattle and protection of the cattle industry in Michigan.

We favor the introduction and passage by the 1953 legislature of a bill equal to House Bill No. 187 of the 1952 legislature providing for the testing of cattle at auctions.

No. 3 Dipping Sheep
There has recently been developed a product known as benzene hexachloride which, when properly used, is an effective one dip treatment against sheep scab; and whereas the present law requires that sheep imported into Michigan be dipped twice at not less than ten days nor more than fourteen days apart; when supervision of the State Veterinarian which causes additional expense to the state and owner of the sheep. Now therefore be it resolved: That this organization go on record as favoring an amendment to the law which will permit the use of Benzene Hexachloride or any other one dip material for the dipping of sheep that are imported into Michigan.

No. 4 Market News Service at Auctions
For many years the livestock producers of the nation have had the benefit of government market news reporting from the large terminal markets such as Chicago, Omaha, St. Louis, Kansas City, Denver and many others.

Since 1923 the percentages of different kinds of livestock sold direct from decentralized market points has doubled. More than one half of the hogs in the United States, one third of the calves, sheep and lambs and one quarter of the cattle are now sold direct.

The problem confronting the farmers is the obtaining of information on market quotations from decentralized points so that they may properly judge and compare the marketing strength at the available markets.

The increasing volume of livestock being marketed through auctions, concentration points and direct to packers in Michigan and the nation, warrants a more complete market news reporting service.

We recommend that the Michigan Live Stock Exchange co-operating with the entire marketing industry, State Department of Agriculture and United States Department of Agriculture initiate the development of a uniform livestock market reporting system for the livestock markets of Michigan.

No. 5. Vesicular Exanthema
There has recently occurred in Michigan, outbreaks of Vesicular Exanthema, a highly contagious and infectious disease of swine.

This has caused the State of Michigan and the Federal Government to pay several thousand dollars in indemnities and subjected swine producers to quarantines and possible loss of revenue.

With few exceptions the disease has occurred only on garbage feeding premises; now therefore be it resolved that this organization go on record as favoring House Bill No. 30 which provides for licensing all garbage feeding premises and the cooking of all garbage feed; and further that this bill be given immediate effect.

No. 6 Support of National Agriculture Program

As producers of Live Stock we wish to commend Secretary Benson in his stand against supporting Live Stock prices. We feel that a large part of the recent drop in prices is due to the fact that controls were not removed in time to allow retail prices to follow wholesale prices which would have removed a large part of the surplus.

We wish to reaffirm our belief that economic freedom is the basis of all our other freedoms. We therefore again emphasize our

opposition to all controls and subsidies.

The Kalamazoo Stove and Furnace Company is being liquidated, but its furnace business will be continued as the Kalamazoo Furnace & Appliance Manufacturing Company, a new organization.

Continued existence of what was at one time the city's largest enterprise was made known following a meeting of directors. Sale of the furnace department and a portion of the manufacturing facilities was approved.

A \$2 liquidation dividend on the old stock was declared, payable March 3, to stockholders of record February 24. Operations were resumed March 1 and it is expected will be in full swing by April 1.

The new company is headed by Clyde C. Whitcomb, vice-president and general manager of the old company since 1948.




