Probate Court Report

The fourth annual report of the Washtenaw County Probate and Juvenile Court has just been released. Compiled by Jay H. Payne, Probate and Juvenile Court Judge, and his co-workers, it contains many statistics which should be of vital interest to all civic groups, as well as P. T. A. and parents. The cases reviewed reveal many interesting community social trends.

In his introduction Judge Payne says, "paralleling our gratefulness for the improvement in our working conditions, promised by the new Court House, is our appreciation of the interest presently being exhibited by the Board of Supervisors and many community groups and individuals in our efforts to improve the facilities for the detention of children whom it has been found necessary to be detained in the county."

In the Probate Division under administration of estates of deceased persons there were 150 wills filed, up 10 from 1951, while there were 165 cases of the appointment of general administrators which was down 20. Real estate inventories were \$2,333,766.63 against \$4,783,480.82 the previous year.

Under the guardianships appointed the personal property inventoried was \$915,783.15 up from \$467,144.66 the previous year.

For the mentally ill, there were 122 petitions filed in 1952 against 143 in 1951 and the 122 emergency commitments against 70 in 1951.

In the Juvenile division, children under 21 years of age, there were 25 petitions for hospitalization against 19 in 1951 and 25 were hospitalized with only 18 in 1951. Of afflicted children there were 216 petitions for hospitalization and 212 hospitalized with only 4 rejected.

Hearings on adoptions for the year were 231 with but 188 in 1951. There were 28 dependent and neglected children and 42 the previous year.

Of alleged delinquent juveniles, under 17 years of age, there were 89 unofficial investigations, 35 of white children, 14 of colored. Of these 13 were for breaking and entering; 8 for stealing; 2 each for possession of stolen property and riding in a stolen automobile; 12 sexual delinquency; 7 runaway; 10 traffic violations; and 32 for miscellaneous conduct.

Disposition of the 58 children in delinquent as of Dec. 31, 1952, was 5 transferred to other counties, and 38 on probation. Three were placed with Private Child

Care Agencies and 12 committed to State Training Schools.

The place of residence of these 58 delinquents is causing some comment. Thirty-one came from Ypsilanti, ten from the City of Ann Arbor, five from Willow Village, Chelsea, three; Milan three; Denton three; Willis two and Saline one.

The origin of the petitions is also interesting. Sixteen came from the Ypsilanti Police Department; six from school authorities; six from parents; seven from outside complainants; five from the

County Agent; one from the State Police; one from the Saline Police and one from the Milan Police.

In 1951 there were 126 juveniles placed in detention, in 1952 but 82. Of these, 51 were Washtenaw County children. There were 49 white boys, 16 negro boys, 16 white girls and one negro girl. The largest numbers in age groups are 27 fifteen years of age; 26 sixteen years of age; and 16 in the fourteen year age group.

The average number in detention per month were 6.83 as against 10.5 in 1951; the average length of detention 3.30 days and the shortest two hours and the longest 20 day.

The Juvenile Division of the Probate Court has 102 wards of which 18 are in Private Child Care agencies. There are nine State wards under county supervision.

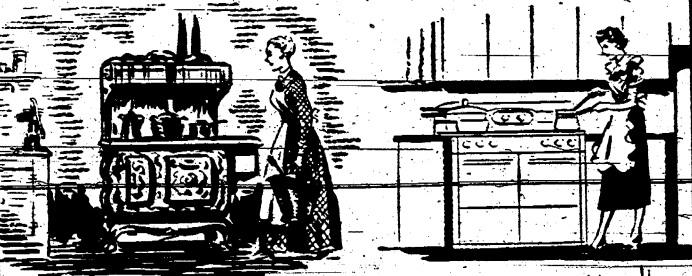
The financial statement for care of children who are wards of the court shows a total appropriation for the year of \$13,000,000. Reimbursements during the year \$2,465.00. Board and care, \$17,305.99. The total amount of expenditures was \$18,871.39 against \$16,172.51 in 1951. There was an over expenditure of \$2,405.59.

2. WHO IS JAMES PICKER?

(1) Bill Larsen, a full-time carpenter, says it is very satisfying. He writes about his occupation in Work magazine. "I enjoy working outside," he comments, "I enjoy working with my hands; I enjoy seeing the result of my work. And, most of all, I enjoy working at something that people need very much." People who complain about the high wages of building trades forget that few craftsmen get paid vacations, and most of them are laid off entirely for about a month in the winter.

(2) James Picker is the man who voluntarily gave the U.S. government \$4 million during the past 10 years. Not in taxes, but as contributions. The story of this unusual person is told by A. E. Hotchner in This Week magazine. Picker is head of the Picker X-Ray Corp. When the company's profits increased sharply at the beginning of World War II due to army orders, Picker began sending large checks to the treasury. Picker explained later that he came to the U.S. as a penniless immigrant boy 52 years ago, and

he appreciates the wonderful opportunities this country has afforded him.

(3) Depends on what you mean by rain making. Since May, 1950, the Water Resources Development Corp. of Arizona has been producing silver iodide smoke and sending it skyward from hills. When the silver iodide hits the right type of cloud, it picks up moisture and gains the weight necessary to fall as a raindrop. Scientists have been experimenting with rain-making processes for many years. Rain making is not successful, however, unless there are rain clouds in the vicinity. The silver iodide simply makes a cloud release more rain than it would naturally.

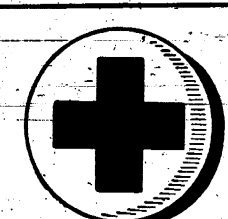
