



Even a small home vegetable garden should be planned to balance production with the family needs.

Without a planned production schedule, it is a common experience to harvest an overabundance of quick growing for the summer. But the space allotted each should be balanced with the family use.

This can be avoided by estimating in advance how much of each cropy your family can use during the period when its quality is high. Then several plantings can be made, so that when the first crop has passed its prime, another will be ready to harvest.

In the table above, the time it takes each of twelve nonular vegetables to reach table size is stated, with the period it remains in prime condition in the garden. It also tells how much space in the row is required to produce one serving of each crops.

You must supply the fourth factor in figuring a schedule, which is the number of servings your family will desire from each sowing. Then sow enough to produce the family needs for the period of good







High insect killing power combined with a high degree of safety to man, animal and crop, make mainthion the fastest growing insecticide in agriculture today.

Prior to the development of malathion, the only insecticides which would at the same time control aphids and spider mites and other important sucking and chewing insects were materials quite toxic to man and animal. These required strict precautionary use measures. In malathion, however, there has been developed for the grower an insecticide that kills the same variety of insects, but as the United States Department of Agriculture puts it, "is one of the safest insecticides to handle."

Maybe your favorite Michigan lake or stream has taken on a muddy or milky look during the past few years—and you've wondered what this particular condition is going to do to the fishing. A recent experiment still not entirely completed gives us important answers, from the State of Oklahoma But first, let's take a quick look at the cause of muddy or turbid fishing waters.

In a lake or pond the condition is the result of a watershed, either from nearby gulleys, or from an actual stream or rivulet. The moving water picks up silt, clay and mud from the banks, carrying it into the still water, which is soon well mired with the turbid solution. Overgrazing of pasture land along a pond or lake edge, or slong a stream bank is a perfect set—up for the formation of loose soil which quickly washes away. And what happens to the fish? Oklahoma tells us:




