

Farmers home Administratio Loans in Fiscal 1255 Reach Recor or \$295,190,000: of \$295,190,000:

Loans made and insured by the Farmers Home Administration in fiscal 1955 totaled \$293,190,000 and reached the highest level in the agency's history. Ervin L. Peterson, acting Secretary of Agriculture, said today.

In 1954 approximatelyy \$292,482,000 was advanced or insured. The 1954 volume of loans represented an increase of 28 percent over the \$228,600,000 loaned in 1953. SZZS.60U,UUU loaned in 1953.
The insured farm loan program was greatly expanded during the year and a soil and water conservation loan program was introduced.

Private lenders provide the funds for insured loans. The Farmers Home Administration makes and services the loans, and guarantees the repayment. The volume of insured loans rose from \$9,500,000 in 1955 due to insured to an articipation, by Londers reased participation by lenders and the use of insured loans in financing soil and water conserva-tion. Previously only farm owner-ship loans were made on an insuri basis. The soil and water conservation The soil and water conservation loan program which began about October 1 iprovides for soil conservation; water development, conservation and use; and drainage.

Loans may be made for such improvements as construction and repair of terraces, ponds, waterways and erosion control structures, ditches and cantals for irrigation and drainage. Also subsoiling, sodding, pasture improvement, brush removel, land leveling, tree planting, well drilling.

During fiscal 1955 approximately 155.000 loans were made to farm families compared to 131.000 in fiscal 1954.
