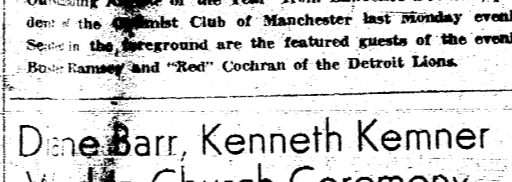

HOW'RE YA GONNA keep 'em down on the farm? Don't even try. These days farmers get around, keep informed, and know the score.

This was proven again last week when 47 men and one woman, all working farmers from Michigan, blanketed Washington to give their government the once-over. Led by Dr. Arthur Mauch, agricultural economist specialist at Michigan State University, the group represented two dozen rural communities, from Gagetown and Genoa, to Paw Paw and Ubly. They hit a fast pace during the four-day public affairs workshop set up by Dr. Mauch, stopping at the Belleville Center for briefings on dairy cattle breeding and milk solids research, visiting the Labor Department for talks on manpower and economic trends, and picking the brains of Agricultural Department officials on farm credit, rural electrification and co-operatives.

I had a great time showing the group around the Capitol and their searching questions kept this old Leaper County farm boy on his toes. As we circled the Senate lobby, the Vice President and Indian Ambassador joined us and were introduced all around. They agreed that so long as vigorous, alert Americans like these Michiganders are running America's vast, productive heartland, the nation's agriculture is in good hands.

CHRISTIAN HERTZER, distinguished Under Secretary of State, spent an hour with me reviewing special Michigan problems as part of a series of meetings with top Administration officials I have set up in an effort to boost industrial activity and increase jobs in our State. So far I have talked with Postmaster General Arthur Sumnerfield, Secretary of Labor James Mitchell and Secretary of the Interior Fred Seaton. Mr. Hertzler, commenting on the St. Lawrence Seaway, termed it a "potential gold mine of international good will." As former Governor of Massachusetts, where the Mayflower II is berthed, Mr. Hertzler enthusiastically commended my proposal for a voyage of the Pilgrim vessel up the Seaway.

Through him, the State Department is smiling on the idea, and we're hoping now for a 1959 Great Lakes tour.

AS BUSY, AIR-MINDED Americans place increasingly heavy demands on their airports, keeping the terminals in first-class condition becomes a smart safety measure. Since airports also play a major role in defense planning, they receive federal funds to supplement improvement money raised locally. Uncle Sam's new budget contains \$2,550,000 for improvements at 26 Michigan airports. Runways will be strengthened, land purchased, new control towers and administration buildings erected. Biggest sum — \$1,000,000 — went to Wayne City Airport, with Willow Run and Lansing drawing over \$200,000 each. Escanaba and Gaylord brought up the rear with \$7,000 each but can look forward to more money as their communities grow.
