Immunization Schedule

A new schedule for administra-tion of "Booster" immunizations for diphtheria and tetanus (lock-jaw) and vaccinations for small pox will be changed for the spring immunization clinics conducted in the schools by the Washtenaw Country Medical Society according County Medical Society according to Dr. Otto K. Engelke, county

health officer.

The booster injections will be given in kindergarten and in the sixth grade. In schools without kindergarten the immunizations will be offered in the first grade. ommended every 3 years follow-ing the initial series of 3 or 4 injections.
Children transferred to the

county during the current school year will be given an opportunity to have immunizations at the clinic, and children who have clinic, and children who have never had any immunization before will be taken in at the clinics if parents request service. No immunization will be offered to preschool age children. After careful study it is indicated that such a schedule will protect a child from these contagious dischild from these contagious dis-

child from these contagious diseases.


Local physicians and staff of the local hospitals serve at the clinics without pay and services of the clinics are available to the children without charge.
