

fit people. The examination itself is not a substitute for visiting one's own physician or dentist for a check-up. While the examination is quite thorough, it does not require undressing below the waist. It is not nainful or embarrassing in any respect, he

None of the information collected about a person in the examination is revealed to anyone other than the person's own physician or dentist. Furthermore, the physician or dentist is told only in case the person has specifically so requested. Examinations are given by invitation only. The invited persons are chosen at random. No substitute persons can be examined, no matter how much they would like to be.

Everyone is given free transportation to and from the place of examination. The examinations all take place in the Health Examination Centers operated by the U.S. Public Service and are given at the convenient hours on weekdays. The Centers, which are housed in special trailers, will be brought to the area shortly before the examinations begin. One of them will be set up in Detroit, on the grounds of the Herman Kiefer Hospital, the other in Ann Arbor on the parking lot of the Veterans Administration Hospital.

On June 14, 1777, — the flew a standard that was somewhat related to the flag we now know. Called the Grand Union Flag, it had 13 red and white stripes in honor of the 13 colonies. The Union-Jack of Great Britain was where our field of 50 stars now fly.

History such as this is under review by Farm Bureau citizenship committees in a majority of the 71 county organizations in Michigan. Since many persons will fly flags during the coming July 4th holiday, the committees are especially concerned with flag rules and etiquette. They pass along some common rules that should be remembered and observed:

In general, treat the flag as it were a "living" flag. I should fly free and unfettered. A bearer should not hold any portion of the flag against the staff, except as momentary protection such as when lowering it through a doorway.

The flag should not be displayed in stormy weather. It should not be used to carry or deliver anything, it should never be used as a receptacle. The flag should not be used for advertising purposes. It should not be printed or imressed on anything designed for temporary use and discarded. It should not be part of a costume or athletic uni-

To honor the passing Flag, as in parades, a man in civilian clothes should always remove his hat with the right hand, hold it at his left shoulder, with hand in position over the heart. Uniformed men render the military salute. Men without hats and women, render a handto-heart salute. Some of the more common

mistakes are made when the flag is placed in a church chancel or on a speaker's plattorm. These rules are to be followed: if displayed without staff, the flag should be flat, above and behind the speaker. When on a staff, the flag should be to the right of the clergyman or speaker as he faces the congregation or audience. Any other flag should be to his left. But the rule is a tricky oneand the order reverses should the flag be placed on the same floor level with the audience. In the case, the flag then is placed to the right of the audience as they face the chancel

PRODUCE A HIGH YIELDING CORN CROP. Now's the time plants field plenty of available plant food. Side-dressing is a good way of adding nitrogen, ing down or applying sufficient amounts in the starter. Corn can be sidedressed until it reaches 12 to 15 inches—but the sconer the better as far as root pruning is concerned. If weather delayed planting, cut back on the nitrogen you normally apply by about a fourth;

acrve your herd for any cattle that may have a weeping discharge from their eyes. Affected cattle lose their appetites and production falls off. Call a veterinarian if the disease is noticed. Total blindness may result unless treatment is begun early. Besides, the disease is infectious and can be spread quickly through the herd if flies are a serious problem.

GET GRAIN BINS CLEANED before combining starts. Give the bin walls and floor a good spraying with a recommended chemical. One of the newest recommendations is to use a mixture of 10 ounces of 57% malathion in 5 gallons of water. Spray this material on until it begins to run off. For further protection, you might apply malathion as a dust or spray at the recommended rate to the

spray at the recommended rate to the grain as you put it in the bin. SCREEN WINDOWS AND DOORS OF POULTRY HOUSES to keep sparrows out during the summer. Otherwise, where they are a serious problem they can add considerably to your feed bill.

One sparrow alone can eat over 6 pounds of feed in a year. Besides sparrows are a possible source of bringing disease into your flock.




