



Child Molesting On Increase

plaints increase at this time of your, perents should strongly want their children against accepting lures of strangers to go or walks or rides, says Sgt. ficer of the Clinton post of the Michigan State Police.

This cautionary advice, given now and occasionally repeated, might prevent some child from suffering an experience which could blight his or her life. Children should be assured

that policemen are friends who want to help and protect them They should be encouraged to otify police of any strangers leitering around playgrounds, schools, public rest rooms or in the neighborhood. Following are suggested

for children: 1. Don't talk to strangers o scept any offer of money, canly or gifts to go for a walk or ride with them.

2. Report to your parents, police or teacher any suspiciou stranger who tries to join you

or your group.

3. Stay with playmates when atdoors. Don't play or walk alone in alleys, deserted buildings or other secluded areas. . Don't go along to the mo les, fairs or camivals. Try to have at least one companion

wherever you go.

5. Keep a safe distance from the road so that a stranger in a passing car cannot easily reach out and seize you. 6. Don't loiter in public rest
