THE SIZE AND SHAPE OF FIELDS have an ever increasing influence on efficiency as larger machinery and equipment are used. In most cases you should consider changing field layout before going to larger equipment. Efficiency can usually be increased by lengthening rows or by changing field shape to save time in turning. If the field is fenced less cropland is wasted with turn-row space by having the rows parallel with the

PAYING FOR HIGH QUALITY LABOR is a good investment. Hiring a man who knows his job and can handle machinery well saves money even though his salary may be higher. The reduction in repair bills alone will usually more than offset the increased wages. The reduction in idle time and a better job done when equipment is operating can be considered as bottless.

INCREASE RETURNS through the use use of optimum rates of fertilizer. For example, the first 50 pounds of fertilizer may yield an additional 30 bushels of corn, the next 50 pounds—15 bushels, the third 50 pounds—15 bushels, etc. As long as additional yields pay fertilizer cost and its application, it is profitable to increase rates. Use soil test results as a guide. As a check, set aside a couple of acres and apply different rates of fertilizer every four rows.
