CROP INSURANCE EXPANSION FOR 1972 LIMITED

Expansion of the U.S.D. A's Federal all-risk crop insurance will be limited for 1972 according to Jesse W. Bishop, area sales director for Illinois, Indiana, Ohio and Michigan.

Corn protection was limited in every county in 1971. For 1972 limitations in some counties provide for no increase in protection. Participation in the self-help farm program will be limited to only maintaining the 1971 participation.

Bishop also pointed out that any policy holder having a loss on corn or soybeans must report this loss to the office for their county as soon as harvest is complete on any unit or by December 10, whichever is earliest. F.C.I.C. fieldmen are taking

applications on a first come first insured basis.




