




A letter to our legislators would help them and us, because by recycling glass we are endorsing those industries that don't wish to make returnable bottles. Can and newspaper recycling is much more important because they can't be returned directly for reuse.



½ cup sugar ½ cup coarsely chopped
1 cup chopped pitted dates
1 teaspoon vanilla 1 can (3 ½ ounce) flaked
2 cups honey-flavored puffed wheat coconut, about 1 ⅓ cups

Combine eggs, sugar and dates in cold lightly buttered skillet. Cook over low heat, stirring constantly about 5 minutes or until mixture is thick and leaves the sides of the pan Remove pan from heat and stir in vanilla. Add cereal, raisins and walnuts; stir until cereal is evenly coated with egg mixture. Drop rounded tablespoonfuls of mixture onto coconut. Sprinkle with coconut; place on baking sheet. Chill; store in refrigerator until served. Yield: 2 dozen cookies.
