B. Dale Ball, director of the Michigan Department of Agriculture, points out that "our state has almost 2 million acres of farmland, and much of it is used for hunting". In addition, Michigan has about 20 million acres of voodland, and over 60 percent is privately owned, mostly by farmers. "Hunting on private property is a privilege, not a right," Ball said. Farmers' woodlots and fields provide a valuable recreational resource. Its availability depends to a great degree on the attitude and actions of those who invade

"Many farmers share a love of nunting, and welcome city and suburban sportsmen to their land," Ball remarked, "as long as hunters don't damage crops or livestock."

Ball urged sportsmen to "ask permission at the farmhouse before/you go into the fields. You'll often be rewarded with information on where crops are planted, where livestock is pastured, and you may even learn where the best cover for game is located."

"Many farmers rely on fences to otect their livestock and crops," Ball explained. Careless hunters can cause severe damage; there have even been cases where a big buck felled by a nimrod turned out to be a dead cow.




come in first or second place in all of




