I am sure that God has some special work for you to do. It may not be the same kind of work you were once used to, but if you ask God how you can serve Him, He will answer you.



about. Santa arrived to pass out gifts. Several scouts received badges and two boys, Doug Drouare and Dan Little, were inducted into the Webloes


The evening ended with punch and Christmas cookies for all.

John is employed by the Willis Building Company as a bricklayer. He is married to the former Deneine Steele and resides at 618 Parr Road.


SCAVENGER HUNT
