THE NITRITE CONTROVERSY

Apparently everything we eat or wear is a potential cancer causer. At least one could come to that conclusion since every few months another government report comes out saying one more item is cancer causing. The latest is lipstick dye, with the nitrite issue in cured meats

still in limbo from a few months back. We haven't seen reports on how much lipstick would have to be worn daily for the dyes to cause cancer, but, according to the American Meat Institute, you'dhave

THURSDAY, JANUARY 12, 1978 THE MANEUESTER JUNTERPRISE PAGE 9 to eat over 15 pounds of nitrite cured bacon a day for the rest of your life in order to get the same amount of the substance that was found to cause cancer in rates in the German Cancer Research Institute. That's a little sails on the bacon when you're more accessomed to two to three slices a day. It's also unrealistic for the government to ban a product when it would take 15 pounds

a day to cause any possible harm. What if nitrite curing is banned? What sort of effect will it have on pork producers in this country? The American Meat Institute says it would cause an annual income loss to hog producers of at least \$500 million. This would then translate to fewer hog farmers and even less employment in farming, and less in meat packing, distribution and retail establishments, loss of export markets for pork. losses from the closing of facilities and less choice for consumers at the meat

The reason for all this potential loss is that 70 per cent of our pork ends up in processed meat products, and most of this is in cured meats using the nitrite products. The retail cost of cured meat sold each year exceeds \$12 billion.

So, not only is the banning of nitrites unrealistic from the standpoint of the risk of causing cancer, it would be another economic blow to the already battered agricultural economy in this country.
