In Retrospect

omitted at least one chapter in Manchester's history and while recalling this period we find that there is a narrow line between fact and fancy in the tales that are told of this period. There was a time in the early 1920's when many tales are told about the happening of that time and the events that took place here.

Those were the days of "local option", a term now long definct but which meant that each town or county or other political area fouls decide for themselves whether booze (beer or whiskey or both) could be sold in a particular area, and Clinton, and I believe Lenawee County, were "dry" while Manchester and Washtenaw County was "wet". We have been told that the WCTU was a thriving group in Clinton, Blissfield, Tecumseh and other Lenawee areas, but the demon rum and considerable quantities of beer were dispensed in Manchester from the eight saloons that we are told were in business here at that time. Then too, there was a busy and prosperous brewery out of his eye and very soberly replied "Yes, south of town on what was then, and is now dear, and on my wife's side too". to many people "Brewery Road", rather than Schleweis Road.

Of course at that time automobiles were not too common but the railroad from Jackson to Toledo boasted at least two trains in each direction each day and they were very well patronized, especially on weekends. A considerable portion of the parched males from Clinton, Tecumseh and other nearby points converged on Manchester to shake their thirsts and good fellowship was rampant hereabouts.

There are many tales of the problems which beset the visitors to our town during this period. We recall one about a Clinton citizen who, after filling needs to the "Fullest extent", packed a suitcase which he had thoughtfully brought with him, with various liquid refreshments to tide him over until his next visit. However he dallied at one of the saloons until he heard the whistle of the approaching homebound train and then made a mad dash to the depot, arriving just as the train was pulling out. He managed to run fast enough to catch the last car of the train and tossing the suitcase aboard he stumbled up the steps of the car. The suitcase landed on the car platform not too gently and as it did so the tinkle of breaking glass was heard, and the suitcase began to leak.

It was reported that the spectators assisted the owner of the suitcase to mourn his loss and some said that the platform was drenched with a mixture-50% tears and Local McDonald's participants at the "Big more, Crew Person; Kathy Roof, Crew 50%drinkables.

Then came prohibition, the saloons closed became a ghost of its former self but still may be seen there remnants of the building and the storage cave in which the brew was stored awaiting delivery. 

"Operation Care"

Michigan State Police traffic patrols again taking part in "Operation CARE". will focus attention during the 30-hour July 4th holiday period on high risk road areas and the normally heavy travel hours in afternoon and evening, Col. Gerald L. Hough, department director, has reported.

In pursuing "Operation CARE" objectives, the trooper patrols will concentrate on speed law enforcement and hazardous violation surveillance which would include drinking drivers, improper passing and lane usage, and following too closely. "CARE" stands for "combined accident reduction effort", a traffic safety program in which Michigan and other states take part during holiday periods with federal fund assist-

State Police traffic officers point out that this will be the first 30-hour July 4th holiday since 1973 and that there already is some indication that the midweek observance will not generate a large volume of motorist travel. This is attributed to the shorter holiday period and to some public concerns about the availability and cost of motor vehicle fuels.

Hough urged all motorists to observe the 55-mile-an-hour national speed limit, pointing out that to some degree it lessens the risk of serious accident and also contributes to motor fuel conservation.

The director noted that State Police records show that traffic accidents during previous 30-hour July 4th holiday periods in Michigan claimed 13 lives in 1973, nine in 1962 and 12 each in 1956 and 1951. Last year the July 4th period was 102 hours long and traffic accidents during that time claimed 23

Grain Reserve Corn -Release Level Announced

On June 20th, the Washtenaw County ASCS office was advised that the Release Level had been reached for corn under the Grain Reserve Program. The Release Level requires the average National Market price to be 125% of the National Corn Rate (\$2.00). All producers were notified of their opportunity to market their reserve corn during the release period which extends until July 31. 1979 without any penalties.

Producers in Washtenaw County have over 350.000 bushels of corn stored under the three year program.

Birthday registrations will affect the vast majority...estimates are well over 95 percent...of Michigan's 7.5-million vehicles. It will take in all privately owned passenger vehicles and all individually owned pickup trucks, vans and trailers.

Excluded are commercial vehicles such as large trucks, semi-trucks, buses, and trailers owned by a company or other nonindividual owners. Expiration date for these vehicles will continue to be the last day of February. Expiration date for motorcycles, ham radio operator plates and personalized plates will continue to be March 31 and are also excluded from the

"birthday" system. According to Austin, the birthday expiration date was chosen because it is easily remembered. Every fourth year, too, persons will be able to renew their driver license at the same time, It also provides for a more even number of registrations each month which make the issuing process quick and efficient.

Austin anticipates only one possible time where there might be some confusion on the new system and that is during the phase-in period during which a person's registration may vary from seven to 19 months. depending on birthdate. Fees, while unchanged, will vary based on the number of months the vehicle is registered.

The amount a person will pay for a registration will be plainly marked on the prepared applications to be sent out to all motorists this Fall. Mail sales which have system should result in a significantly lower proven so popular in the past will also be continued.

"Even though it will be much easier to obtain your tabs at a branch office when the new system goes into effect during the 1981 licensing year," Austin said he still prefers the easier mthod of "using the mail."

After conversion, estimates place yearly savings at about \$400,000 besides streamlining the system. "If you add the benefits of a faster service, getting the vehicle information in the central files more quickly, and ultimately, less personnel to do the job, savings may be more substantial."

What Are Food Stamps?

Food Stamps are coupons, used like money to buy food or seeds and plants to grow food for home use. They can help low-income households buy more food of greater variety to improve their diets. Most grocery stores are authorized to accept Food Stamps. In addition, some non-profit meal delivery services and communaldining facilities for the elderly or handicapped, accept Food Stamps.

They cannot be used to buy non-food items such as soap, pet food, tobacco, paper products, and alcoholic beverages.

The standards for participation in the Food Stamp Program are the same for everyone without regard to race, color. religious creed, national origin, sex, polit-

ical beliefs, handicap or age.



From primitive Upper Peninsula campsites to modern urban-area parks, Michigan offers something for everyone this summer.

A replica of a 19th Century northern Michigan logging camp and a giant collection of artifacts including a "big wheel" once used to skid logs out of the forest draw history buffs to the Lower Peninsula's Hartwick Pines State Park near Grayling. The park also contains the last stand of virgin white and red pine in Lower Michigan, saved from the axe by a lumberman's wife.

A chance to see herds of moose and predaceous wolves draws thousands of visitors annually to Isle Royale. It is the only island national park in the contiguous 48 states and is located 73 miles north of Houghton in Lake Superior.

Campers and hikers frequently see deer, coyote, fox and even black bear in the 58.000-acre Porcupine Mountains State Park near Ontonagon, and in the 19,000acre state park containing the picturesque Upper and Lower Tahquamenon Falls.

While visitors are unlikely to see anything wilder than ground and tree squirrels at Interlochen State Park south of Traverse City, they might encounter the strains of "Peter and The Wolf," "The Firebird." or "Swan Lake" at the adjacent National Music Camp.

At other state lands, the accent is on picnics, swimming and fun in some of Michigan's 10,000 inland lakes.

The 600-foot sandy shoreline at Pontiac Lake Recreation Area near Pontiac is billed as the state's largest man-made inland lake

Other expansive inland beaches include Aloha State Park's 3,900-foot shore on Mullett Lake near Cheboygan; the milelong sand and grass shoreline at Higgins Lake State Park near Roscommon; the 500- and 200-foot beaches of Island Lake Recreation Area near Brighton, and the 1,400-foot beach on Lake Charlevoix in Young State Park near Boyne City.

Detroit-area bathers and picnickers gather at the Huron-Clinton Metropark beaches at Metropolitan Beach on Lake St. Clair near Mount Clemens, Stony Creek Metropark near Utica, and at Kensington Metropark near Milford

Formerly an Army post, Fort Custer

Recreation Area near Battle Creek offers 2,962 acres of rolling woodlands and fields

for day hikers. For sun-drenched Great Lakes sand check out crescent-shaped Tawas Point State Park on Tawas Bay and Bay City State Park on Saginaw Bay in Lake Huron, or Sterling State Park on Lake Erie's Brest

Fine examples of "Huron dunes" await visitors to Rogers City's P.H. Hoeft and Caseville's Albert E. Sleeper State parks along Lake Huron while miles of squeaky "sugar sand" delight beachcombers at Holland, Grand Haven, Ludington and Muskegon state parks on Lake Michigan.

Examples of Lake Michigan's sandy bluffs include the world's largest shifting sand dunes, reached via hiking trails or auto at the 61,000 acre Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore near Glen Haven. Others are at Warren Dunes State Park south of St. Joseph.


State recreation lands have provided anglers access to some of this state's best fishing lakes, with many near major cities.

Yankee Springs Recreation Area between Grand Rapids and Kalamazoo offers 10 lakes for fishing while Hayes State Park southeast of Jackson has fishing on two lakes set among the verdant Irish

Barely a dozen miles from each other, Newaygo State Park on the Muskegon River's Hardy Dam pond is a hotspot for walleyes and northern pike, while White Cloud State Park is only three miles from the White River, a top steelhead trout:

Big game anglers after salmon can launch boats at many parks bordering the Great Lakes, including J.W. Wells State Park near the Cedar River in the Upper Peninsula's Menominee County.

The sites listed are just samples of the unique offerings of Michigan's federal and state lands. This year, an estimated 24 million persons will visit them to relax

HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO U.S. -AMERICANS

Traditionally, Americans have long been classified as "joiners", a label many citizens are proud of.

Voluntarism is a typical USA characteristic that has helped shape the image of U.S. citizens in many countries. Americans are frequently pictured as friendly, outgoing and self-reliant.

Such a flattering concept probably dates back to the Revolutionary War era when our fledgling nation was struggling to survive. Self-reliance was then an essential quality.

These facts take on renewed significance as the nation prepares to celebrate the 203rd birdthday of the United States of America. The American Historic and Cultural Society, Inc., has vigorously promoted patriotic community programs through the preceding 21 days extending to Flag Day. The 21-day Honor America concept is a parallel to the 21-gun salute to honor a head of

This period was officially created by a joint resolution of the Congress and signed into law by the President in June 1975. Members of Congress, governers and mayors have actively joined in supporting this campaign and have called on their constitutents to participate.

A Census Bureau survey in recent years produced the estimate that 37 million people in the United States above the age of 13 years are engaged in volunteer work in the spirit of helping others.

Such a figure reflects a wholesome, generous attitude that has helped this nation become the leader of the world's democracies.

This total denotes a substantial bloc of Americans that by its example invites others to enter the field of voluntarism. To a casual observer it might seem that so many willing hands could dispose of the bulk of the country's social problems. Unfortunately, emergencies of assorted types, adversities and personal hardships continue to multiply.

Other circumstances call for different approaches. In Oregon, a 100,000acre site formerly used as a rocket-test range was turned over to farming by an aerospace company. The land lies in an arid region and the belief prevailed that "Nothing will grow here." But new methods of cultivation have produced rewarding crops and helped to revive the area economically.

In another corner of the country, Robert Sanchez, 29, worked with two scientists of the University of New Mexico to develop a program to produce nuclear drugs. This breakthrough enables hospitals to use the drugs as tracing

Such undertakings contribute to the health and wealth of the nation. But these events are large and complex and beyond the scope of the average

But much can be accomplished at the local level to Honor America, You and your neighbors can arrange for appropriate patriotic decorations; centering around the American flag. Remind your club, your union or other organization to lend impetus to such observances, possibly of a financial nature. Remember John Adams' note to his wife Abigail: "... this great anniver-

sary festival ought to be commemorated as the day of deliverance, by solemn acts of devotion to God Almighty ..."

Plan a parade, whip up a picnic, promote a sports contest, schedule a band concert, put on a pageant, touch off a fireworks display, honoring America One point, at any rate is clear: no manner of organizational gadgetry can

make a great society. It takes people to make a society great-righteous, justice-loving, idealistic, freedom-loving people. Join us in giving America a Happy Birthday this Fourth of July.

In Retrospect

This year is the 100th anniversary of the writing of a book by Henry George. Henry was a man with a one-track mind. Born in 1839 in Philadelphia he became a journeyman printer, reporter and editor and early in his adult life went to San Francisco where he got the idea that became the driving force of his life.

One day he noticed that land in the downtown area there was selling for \$1,000 an acre-at that time an unbelievable sum and he became obcessed with the thought that there was something wrong with this. The people who were asking \$1,000 an acre for the land had done nothing to make it worth that. The land had gained in value because people came there, lived there and transacted business there.

He decided that the land, which he thought should really belong to the people. was being taken over by a parasitic landowing class. This was not news but his suggested solution was.

He advocated that all taxes be abolished and that a single tax on all land be substituted for them; that the unearned "rent" that unjustly went to the landlord should cover the costs of all government. This "rent" was to be taxed for the benefit of all the people and that all land should be owned by all the people, so he wrote a book explaining his philosophy. I suppose you might call this philosophy Socialism. Titled "Progress and Poverty" it is basically the philosophy advocated by Gov. Jerry Brown and others. Mr. George was perhaps a hundred years ahead of his time.


To explain his theory with an example: i the land down on the main four corners of town was occupied by a business that made a large profit, those who operated it paid a rather large "rent" for the use of the land occupied by their business. To equalize this amount an acreage of farm land of considerable size would be taxed on its ability to produce a profit, or at much less
