Hungarian paprika potatoes also use cream, but in this case it's sour cream. Wash, peel and cube two pounds of Michigan potatoes. Heat 3 tablespoons butter in a heavy casserole. Add one medium onion, thinly sliced, and cook until onion is tender. Add the potatoes, threequarters cup water, a teaspoon of salt. 2 tablespoons paprika, a dash of pepper, and two bay leaves. Simmer covered over moderate heat about 10 minutes, until potatoes are tender but firm. Shake the pan to prevent sticking, add a bit more water if necessary. Remove the bay leaves, stir in 1 tablespoon vinegar, and cook another minute or two. Stir in one-third cup sour cream and heat, but do not boil. Sprinkle with parsley and serve.



CHRONIC BRONCHITIS

Spring is here but your winter cold lingers on. You cough. You spit. And if you're a heavy smoker, too, it could be chronic bronchitis.

Chronic bronchitis is nearly always associated with heavy cigarette smoking. It's likely to start in middle age and get worse as the years go on unless you seek help from a doctor early on. About three times as many men get chronic bronchitis women. Most people with chronic bronchitis live in cities where air pollution

The American Lung Association says that because people don't consider chronic bronchitis a killing disease, it is often neglected until it is in an advanced stage and there is serious damage to the lungs. But in 1981, about 7.1 million people suffered from chronic bronchitis. It brought death to about 3,900. Physicians report more than 330,000 new patients with chronic bronchitis every year. The Social Security Administration grants disability benefits to about 1,500 victims a year. Undoubtedly, chronic bronchitis is one of the nation's costliest diseases in terms of manpower, money and misery. Since people who get chronic bronchitis

are nearly always smoking, the cough is usually dismissed as only "smoker's cough." As time goes on, though, colds become more damaging. Coughing and spitting last longer after each cold. 

The United States Weather Bureau has divided tornado signals into two definitons. The first is called a tornado watch. This watch is issued where tornados may occur during the next several hours. The size of the average tornado watch area is approximately 100 miles wide and 300 miles long. The second signal is defined as a tornado warning. This means that a tornado has actually been sighted in the area or that its presence has been detected

If a tornado watch is broadcast before 1:30 P.M. all children will be sent home. If the tarnado watch is broadcest after 1:30 P.M. the children will be dismissed at their

If a tornado warning is issued students will not be dismissed from school. If the Michigan. MTA-Supported **Property Tax Plan**

Robert Robinson, executive director of the Michigan Townships Association (MTA) announced in a news conference today the details of the MTA-supported property tax plan. The statewide organization, made up of 1,225 member townships and 6,500 township officials, went on record as supporting a plan that takes the principal responsibility of supporting school operating costs off the property tax.

MTA's proposal would cut 78% off the school operating portion of the property tax up to a ceiling of \$1,800 for resident homesteads and \$2,500 for resident farms. Those ceilings would be indexed to the increases or reductions in State Equalised Valuations (SEVs.) Homeowners over 62 years of age would pay no school operating taxes. The tax plan also calls for holding schools, business and industry harmless from replacing any losses due to taxpayer exemptions. It also provides that agricultural and forestry land may be

assessed on use rather than market value. The property tax cuts would cause a shortfall of \$1.5 billion. Approximately \$1 billion of that loss would be made up through circuit breaker savings and by increasing the sales tax by 1 cent.

The remaining \$500 million could be made up either through the Legislature increasing the state income tax by eighttenths of a percent or cutting services.

"Never before have the State coffers or the school funding system been in this kind of shape," said Robinson. Though we would have preferred to support a cut rather than a shift, we realize that this State is in deep trouble and can't afford it right now.

"We believe our members and the rest of the state are clamoring for property tax relief, however, and we feel it's time to Meeting Notice base school funding more on the ability to





Health For All

The baby was premature and first few days after birth. Oxygen therapy and good nursing care helped to save his life, but his bewildered parents soon learned that he'd have to stay in the hospital for a while because of

bronchopulmonary dysplasia (BPD). BPD is a disease that develops premature infants-most often those born under eight months-who have Respiratory Distress Syndrome (RDS). These babies frequently need oxygen and respirators to assist their breathing, prevent brain damage, and save their lives The oxygen these premature babies need can be toxic to their lungs, however, and if they must use a respirator, the danger of BPD is increased."

BPD is diagnosed by X-raying the baby's chest while he or she is recovering from RDS. Once BPD has been diagnosed, there is no special or speedy cure. Normally, the baby's lungs will repair themselves over time, but the child will require long-term hospitalization. Parents of BPD habies are advised to be patient, loving and careful while their bebies are still hospitalized, and even more careful of their babies' overall health after the infant is

The American Lung Association is trying to help parents of infants suffering from BPD understand both the disease and what they can do. 



Question: I've read that I can renew my driver's license by mail from now on. Is

that true? Governor: If you are under 71 years of age and your record has been free of driving violations for the previous four years, you may renew your license by mail for one four-year period. You must certify to your physical ability to operate a motor vehicle. The new law also allows new drivers to waive a road test if they have passed a driver education course which included at least one hour of driving on a freeway. In addition to the convenience this measure will offer Michigan motorists, it is expected to save the state approximately \$500,000.

Question: My children brought home materials during Michigan Tornado Safety Week that said our state is hit by an average of 17 tornadoes every year. Was the recent Kalamazoo tornado the worst?

Governor: Michigan experienced its worst tornado day on Palm Sunday, April 11. 1965, when several tornadoes struck the southern counties and caused 53 deaths Five persons were killed that day.

Michigan Tornado Safety Week was established to make people aware of the Service, the public and private school
