



The Luminaria is said to have its origin in the sixteenth century, when Mexican Indians set many Luminarias (bonfires) on the patios of their churches and on the flat roofs of their adobe homes on Christmas Eve to light the way for the Holy Couple. In the cities, these bonfires came to be replaced by an ingenious arrangement in which a paper bag was weighted down with sand and a small candle placed inside. The American version known as the Southwest when the first wagon trains arrived from St. Louis in the early 1820's.

Today in the Southwest, homeowners put out thousands of paper bag lights in front of their homes. Visitors to this area have been so impressed with the Luminaria displays, that the custom has spread to many sections of the United States and Canada. 

HIT or MISS

The meterologists have now joined the economists in making predictions for the coming months. It's gonna be cold because we are told that it is gonna be cold. Just that thought is supposed to be chilling. The greatest invention since that of the thermometer is the wind chill factor. This is a figure that tells a person how cold the wind makes him feel. For example when the thermometer sez it is 20F and the wind is blowing at 10 miles an hour the wind-chili temperature is SF., so you are supposed to feel cold even if you aren't.

The National Weather Service was founded in 1870 as a part of the Signal Corps and up to that time we had no one to tell us about the coming hard winters except the fuzzy bugs and caterpillars and arthritics but now they are using computers for this purpose and there are weather men staring out at us from every TV screen and threatening us with their dire predictions.

renter and I've heard that a new tax change could increase my state income tax rebate this year. I hope so.

Governor: Several property tax changes have been adopted recently. The one you refer to provides that a senior citizen whose rent exceeds 50 percent of total household income in the 1982 tax year will receive a credit equal to the amount by which the rent exceeds 50 percent of income. For 1983, the credit is based on 45

percent of household income and for 1984 and thereafter, 40 percent. This year, at 50 percent, the new provision will provide renting senior citizens with an additional \$2 million in property tax rebates returned as state income tax credits; at 45 percent. and additional \$3.4 million will be returned. and at 40 percent, there will be an

additional \$5.5 million. Another change for the 1982 tax year involves high income taxpayers. Property tax credits will be reduced by 10 percent for every \$1,000 of household income in excess of \$65.000.

Extended to the 1982 and 1983 tax years is the provision which reduces property tax credits by an amount proportionate to the percentage of household income made up of Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC) or General Assistance (GA) payments.

Question: The teachers at my daughter's school system seem very young to me. Are most teachers in Michigan younger than they used to be?

Governor: No, they are older on the average. In the 1981-82 school year, the average age of Michigan schoolteachers was 41 years, while in the 1974-75 school year, the average was 37 years. Because of leclining enrollment, fewer new teachers are being hired every year, resulting in a steady increase in the average age of all teachers. Most classroom teachers who have been laid off in recent years because of declining enrollments have been younger teachers who have less seniority. Only 899 new teachers were hired in Michigan last year compared to 5.557 new teachers hired for the 1974-75 school year.

Public school enrollment in Michigan dropped from 2.2 million students in 1971-72, to about 1.8 million last year.


Manchester Community Schools Education Week A Success





REYES SYNDROME

Along with snow and ice, the late fall and winter in Michigan is the season for What's Cooking influenza and other respiratory illnesses. Influenza is an acute viral disease in Michigan? characterized by fever, headache, muscle aches, weakness, runny nose, sore throat and/or cough of several days duration. The illness is usally self-limited but can produce severe complications or death in the elderly or those with chronic illnesses that reduce the body's resistance to disease.

Reyes Syndrome is a serious complication of influenza or chickenpox that occurs in about one of every five thousand children who get these viral infections. Last year 24 Michigan children contracted Reves Syndrome and eight of these children died. Reyes Syndrome is characterized by sudden onset of repeated vomiting and behavioral changes (e.g. extreme lethargy, combative or unusual actions) in a child who has, or who has recently recovered from, a viral illness. Children with symptoms of Reves Syndrome should be seen by a physician as soon as possible because early treatment is
